

# Blue Reading Sentence Cards

## Make Copies:

Make 1 copy of the Sentence Card Master.

## Blue Poster Board:

Cut 6 blue cards to measure 6" x 3".

## Color:

Color the pictures on the white paper copy with colored pencils.

## 1 Set of White Paper Copies:

Cut each of the Sentence Cards to measure 5 ½" x 2 ¾".  
(See Sentence Cutting Diagram)

## Mounting:

Mount white paper Sentence Cards onto blue poster board cards.

## Laminate:

Laminate the Sentence Cards.

## Box:

A box to hold the cards.

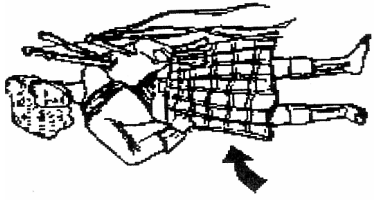

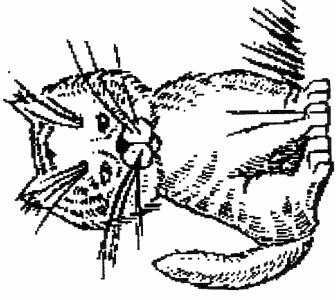

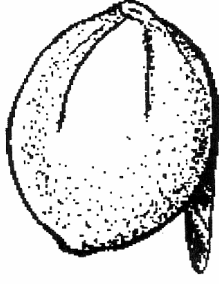

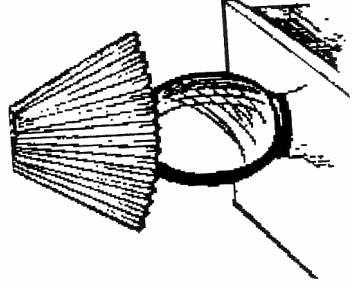

# Sentence Cards - Presentation

## Materials:

A Box containing –

(6) Cards containing a sentence using 4 or more letter phonetic words with a corresponding picture at top left hand corner.

Sentence Cards should be mounted on blue tag board which measures 6" x 3".

## Presentation:

1. Take the child over to where this activity is kept. (The child will know next time where to find it)
2. Take a Sentence Card Box to a table.
3. Place the Sentence Cards in a pile on top of the table with the writing side up.
4. The teacher should demonstrate first by reading out loud the first sentence card and then place it above the sentence card pile picture side up.
5. After the teacher has read a few more cards, the child should be invited to read the next one.
6. The child should finish reading the rest of the cards.
7. Replace the Sentence Cards into the box.
8. Return the activity to the appropriate place.

## Extensions:

- Take the Punctuation Cards to the table and review them with the child.
- Then place the Punctuation Cards on the table in a row from left to right.
- After reading each Sentence Card, place it underneath the punctuation card that is used in the sentence. (The period will have the most cards).
